OPPOSITION SAYS 11 JANUARY BAN ON UK VISITORS IS TOO LAX

Premier and Minister for Finance Hon. Andrew Fahie has lashed out at critics who said that the government should not have placed a ban on United Kingdom travelers to the Territory.

The government announced that the measure was in response to news that a new strain of the COVID 19 virus was circulating in the United Kingdom. The disclosure of the temporary ban was made by the Minister for Health Hon. Carvin Malone during the 31 December sitting of the House of Assembly. Hon. Malone told Legislators, "Cabinet has decided in light of the new strain of COVID-19 prevalent in the United Kingdom (UK), to implement a travel ban effective 11th January 2020 of persons travelling from

the UK to the British Virgin Islands except for Nationals, Belongers, Residents, work permit holders, persons permitted to reside in the Territory, diplomats and persons employed by Government and Statutory agencies."

The Minister further stated, "The new strain is currently thought to cause more infections, ... if introduced into the Territory, it has the potential to cause more disease and greater strain on already tight resources. Numerous countries have already decided to restrict air traffic and entry of persons from the United Kingdom."

However, the fact that the United Kingdom is the Territory's mother country caused the news of the travel ban to sit uneasily among some residents. The

concerns were therefore put to Premier Fahie who responded in the House of Assembly.

During the 31 December House of Assembly sitting Mr. Fahie announced that

concerned residents were contacting him to comment on whether the government should implement such a ban.

In recounting such conversations to Legislators

the Premier said, "Somebody Whatsapp me while I am here sitting down and ask me how can we ban the UK, again missing the boat. We must be the last persons to do this."

Hon. Fahie stressed that there is growing international concern about the new strain and as a government his administration has to take actions aimed at safeguarding. "There's a new strand of COVID 19 going on and the whole world is concerned about it...scientists are concerned about it...and you are going to tell me that we as a Territory must not move quickly to try to protect our people and protect us all. None of

us are immune. COVID 19 doesn't come and say because you are rich I am going to skip you over or that you have financial challenges we are going to skip you over or if you are intelligent you are going to skip over," Hon. Fahie added.

He went on to say: "These are things we don't want to do but we are forced to do to safeguard the Virgin Islands and keep us safe.... This new strain of COVID 19 has a multiplier effect that the experts told us last night that if it was

going to spread to ten persons with this new strand it can spread to 14 persons much faster. We have to be careful and diligent."

Meanwhile Opposition Member and Fourth District Representative, Hon. Mark Vanterpool said that he thinks that the government's UK travel ban deadline is lax. Hon. Vanterpool's comment was in response to the Minister's announcement of 11 January as the effective date of the ban.

Hon. Vanterpool told the House, "We are responding to even let travel from the UK continue until the 11 January. In my cautious opinion, I think that is a long time because the strain could be coming in every day. I don't know how travel is coming from the UK right now but that's one of the decisions that has been made...I think it is incumbent ... to keep as best as possible our cautions up."

Brexit confirmed as "Bad News" for BVI

Unfortunately, Brexit is now official, and some of the fears that the BVI has had as it relates to losing European Union funding and free movement have come to realisation. The BVI was never consulted about Brexit, although many BV Islanders and residents hold a British/European Union passport, and the Territory is called the British Virgin Islands. The UK government overlooking and ignoring these important aspects has not registered well with the BVI citizenry and BVI residents: the discontent, however, will make itself heard in due course. We have seen articles confirming that the UK will become a huge international offshore financial hub, which means it will be serious competition for the BVI if our Financial Sector survives all the draconian measures inflicted on it by the UK.

The Brexit sad news was underlined by Premier Andrew Fahie in a statement following the official severance between the Territory's mother country the United Kingdom and the European Union.

Hon. Fahie mentioned that now that Brexit is a reality BV Islanders will no longer retain the right to

move freely across the European Member States. He said, "Holders of British Passports and British Overseas Territories (BOTC) passports traveling as Tourists will now have visa-free travel for up to 90 days in any 180-day period, while traveling within the Schengen Area." The BVI was never consulted about this probable and disastrous outcome, neither the BVI government took steps to prevent such a debacle from being inflicted on its citizens.

"Persons planning longer stays for work, to study, or to conduct business in the EU, are advised to check the requirements as they will be subjected to the immigration controls of each individual EU Member State. Persons should be prepared to answer questions regarding the reasons for their visit and their financial capacity to sustain themselves while in Europe. In this regard, British Citizens will now be required to meet the entry requirements set out by each individual country. Persons travelling for work, secondment, or to study, may now be required to obtain a work permit or student visa for that country," the Premier further explained.

It was explained that changes will even be made to the current UK passports that many BV Islanders hold. According to Hon. Fahie, "Holders of the burgundy UK passports, with the words 'European Union' on the cover, are advised that these passports will continue to be valid until the stated expiration date, and will be replaced with dark blue British Passport when submitted for renewal."

The Territory has benefited over the years from EU funding and from 2016 when BREXIT was announced the fear of losing such access was a big concern to the BVI Government. Unfortunately, it was announced that the worst has come to pass.

In reporting on this, Hon. Fahie explained: "Following the Joint Ministerial Council meetings held at the end of November this year, it has been confirmed that while existing projects will be allowed to continue, the Virgin Islands and other British Overseas Territories will no longer have access to any future funding support from the EU for sustainable development after today when the transition period comes to an end." The UK on its part knew about this disastrous outcome but offered no tangible and effective remedy to

Overseas Territories, including, of course, the BVI.

Trade with the EU is another concern and one only needs to read the 1,200 pages of the big deal agreement signed by PM Boris Johnson. Commenting on the sad news the Premier reported: "In regard to trade, the new UK-EU Trade and Cooperation Agreement provides for tariff-free and quota-free trade in goods, between the UK and the EU. The Overseas Territories are not included in this arrangement, however, with the exception of Tristan Da Cunha for the export of Lobster into the EU market. From 1st January 2021, the other Overseas Territories will no longer enjoy tariff-free and quota-free access in the export goods to the EU Market. As the BVI and other Overseas Territories had non-reciprocal access to the EU market, goods imported from the EU will not be affected."

"The new UK-EU Trade and Cooperation agreement does not cover Trade in Services, including Financial Services, which will be addressed in a subsequent agreement at a later date. As the EU conducts trade with the BVI as a Third Country, the BVI's trade in Services with the EU will not be affected by the new arrangement," he further explained.

Community up in Arms for Noisy Bikers: Premier promises measures

Some senior citizens have complained to Premier and Minister for Finance Hon. Andrew Fahie about noisy scooter riders that are disturbing their peace. It was reported that the nuisance riders even hurled expletives at an elderly citizen who asked for them to keep the noise down. Such a complaint has caused Hon. Fahie to issue a warning and plead – for such behavior to stop.

For years, residents have used various forums to complain about the noisy bikes that many said are altered to cause such raucous. The matter has even been stressed by members of the House of Assembly with no effect.

However, the situation seems to have reached a climax with the Premier making a public plea with the riders to discontinue the noise-making or have the government take action. “I love bike riding, but those of you with these loud motorbikes that go into these areas late night and afternoon, it is a nuisance! and I'm asking you to put on the silence on your bike and avoid these areas,” Hon. Fahie said.

But, there is a clear law about noise pollution and the police should enforce it automatically. The noise is more pervasive from Government House to Peebles Hospital and beyond and it is deliberate because mufflers have been altered. Why it has taken all this time? The Governor himself should have taken action at an early stage.

The Premier noted that Government can step in and create policies to halt such occurrences but he said that he first wanted to ask the riders to take stock. “We as a government don't want to have to come to put measures in place for this, so I'm asking with a clarion call to all bikers, put on a silencer on your bike and stop this loud noise all around the place where persons are calling us and you are doing it in hours, in places, where there's a lot of seniors... they can't get any rest, in all the residential areas.”

Hon. Fahie said that he will not be afraid to take action if necessary, regardless of if it causes him votes next election. “Be considerate... Some

person told me that I am not going to touch it because we will lose the young vote. Man look, COVID-19 you don't know who will make it into 2021, 2022. Am I studying an election in 2023? Be considerate, wrong can't be right whether you talking about the election or not.”

While noting that he is being inundated with complaints about the bikers the Premier repeated his public requests to the bikers, “I am asking these bikers those who have these loud bikes all about the place as the Premier of the Territory I am asking you. I am pleading with you to put yourself in the position of most of these persons who have worked hard during the week, then come home Sunday afternoon and all the noise you're going with the bike, put a silencer on the bike.”

While alluding to the fact that scooter riders often end up in accidents and require medical attention that is sometimes paid for by the government, the Premier pointed out, “As a matter

of fact, I'm going to tell the bikers something – when I am calculating the amount of money that we have to spend with medical bills for the bikers that are injuring themselves it makes me wonder now if some other measure has to be put in place. We had an amnesty by the Minister of Transportation, he said come bring the bikes, license them, insure them.”

The constant complaints and situation seem to have caused the government to put a temporary halt on plans to allow larger bikes to enter the Territory. In zooming on this decision Hon. Fahie told the House: “I love bikes, yes we were coming to have some bigger bikes in the place. We'll put what we have to put on hold, fix those areas and move again... You don't just blanket all persons, and blanket all bikers that they're bad. I can't go down that road. At the same time, we have to deal with those who decide that they're not going to adhere to God nor man.”

Hospitality industry reactivated, but Hon. Vanterpool says hard times will last

Although tourists have begun arriving in the Territory and some tourism-oriented businesses are functioning again, Fourth District Representative and Opposition Member Hon. Mark Vanterpool said that the economy has still not rebounded and people in the Territory are still suffering.

Hon. Vanterpool while speaking in the House of Assembly on 31 December said that things are hard for a large number of persons in the BVI. He told legislators: “It's not everybody that is out to work in full force as yet and may not be until probably the next six to three months. The lingering effects are still there. Persons are suffering, persons are still having difficulty on a daily basis.”

He said that as a District Representative he is doing his best

to help those in need. However, Hon. Vanterpool noted that many persons who are really in need are not asking for help. Therefore, he said that he is forced to decipher who the needy folks are and find ways to assist: “It is a common thing in the BVI where persons don't always - as a general rule - like to put their hands out; yes, we might think so in some cases, but many persons who are accustomed to fending for themselves are embarrassed to show their face as they are suffering so they stay in the background.”

The Fourth District Representative told the House of Assembly, “While we might say we are not alone, it is still a fact that we are facing you every day... You see people in their desperation. Up to this morning ...I had to deal with a family, and not just their family, but the extended persons around

them who were having difficulty and even facing hardship with food and other important essentials that they need to survive.”

He called on legislators to do more intervention and be mindful of the realities on the ground, and said, “Let us not let down our guard. People are still suffering tremendously in the Territory and I know that although the economy is open to a certain extent; I know the Premier will be bearing in mind difficulties that people are having and it won't be over because he said 1 December we opened our borders. It continues, so we have to see how people will survive. Hopefully, over the next three to six months we can hope to see some turn around after vaccination throughout the world.”

Meanwhile, Hon. Vanterpool said that he does not envision that things

will return to normal very soon: “I don't see the seriousness of the economy returning to at least a state where people could have full employment before next fall, say October. We still have to be grateful that we are surviving, we are trying our best, but we must bear in mind that people continue to suffer – individuals in their homes, families; and we must find ways to continue to buttress support for them.”

“This is going to continue, it is not over. I think people are getting the wrong impression that a vaccine is in the air and that people are not suffering anymore. Mr. Speaker it is going to be at least another six months or nine months where people are going to continue to suffer... We have to stay cognizant of it and try to find ways to help in this time of need. I know budgetary-wise it is difficult.”

UPDATE ON THE WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

STATEMENT BY HONOURABLE CARVIN MALONE MINISTER FOR HEALTH AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

Mr. Speaker, I am pleased to present an update on the Department of Waste Management's ongoing efforts to increase recycling and waste reduction in the Territory.

Mr. Speaker, in keeping with the Government's commitment to the 7R's – Reform, Restrict, Reduce, Recycle, Reuse, Return and Rethink—to date, the Territory's WE RECYCLE Programme has established two (2) recycling centres and diverted approximately 3,328 tons of recyclable materials from the incinerator and landfill. This was achieved with the introduction of 51 recycling points on Tortola and Virgin Gorda. In the not too distant future, the Department of Waste Management, in collaboration with Green VI will introduce new recycling bins at these collection points. The new recycling bins will be made of recycled plastic and will be manufactured locally. Mr. Speaker, I am keenly aware that there are a number of recyclers in the territory and I wish to assure each of them that this Government will embrace their efforts and that none will be left behind in their quest.

Mr. Speaker, as part of our ongoing efforts, we created the first ever National Student Recycling Competition in the Virgin Islands. The competition, which is scheduled to end on December 31, 2020, allowed students to collect glass, plastics and aluminum cans and deliver the materials to the designated collection point on their respective island. The student that delivers the most material for each category on each island will win a laptop. Mr. Speaker, I am happy to inform this Honourable House that a total of 123 students participated in this competition. The 123 student represents a total of 27 schools and learning centres across the Territory. According to reports from my team, the students were all excited to take part in the competition and are also involving their families, neighbours and friends. The Competition, which is based on the 7R's concept, is linked to the larger waste management strategy for the Virgin Islands. It is envisaged that the 7R's concept will help transform waste management into something that we can all be proud of.

Mr. Speaker, another aspect of our recycling efforts is the removal of derelict vehicles. Older dilapidated vehicles which are collected by the Department of Waste Management are eventually exported out of the Territory for recycling purposes. The Cabinet of the Virgin Islands recently approved Tortola Concrete Products to process and export derelict vehicles and other scrap metal out of the Country. And for the first time, the Government will attempt to recoup funds from this type of operation by entering into a sales agreement with companies interested in purchasing the scrap metal directly from the Government of the Virgin Islands. Works are expected to start

directly after the holiday break.

As part of this operation, immediately following the first of two trips, the war on derelict vehicles will recommence. All remaining derelicts on Jost Van Dyke, Anegada, Virgin Gorda and Tortola will have no hiding place. An \$80.00 bounty would be paid on any derelict that is spotted, marked and transported to an approved location

of each of the islands. Once delivered to Pockwood Pond, we expect to completely remove all derelict vehicles and scrap metals from the temporary derelict vehicle site in Pockwood Pond and the temporary dumpsite in Cox Heath which were both created as a result of hurricane Irma. The Ministry conducted an operation whereby the Paraquita Bay site was cleared of all

refuse and restored. Illegal dumping at Sea Cows Bay and Paraquita Bay would be traced and violators would be prosecuted.

Mr. Speaker, as we enter into the New Year, the Ministry of Health & Social Development and the Department of Waste Management will continue to strive to find ways to reduce the Territory's dependency on incineration

and landfill operations while improving the waste management system. Agency Red and our team have completed their consultancy and the public consultation phase will commence in early 2021. At the close of the consultation, the Ministry will issue Request for Proposals for the collection of waste and other measures aimed in maintaining a clean and healthy environment.

BVI Red Cross, Green VI and DWM Team Up for Sea Cows Bay Cleanup

The Cleanup was a part of the Enhanced Vulnerability and Capacity Assessment process

Tuesday, January 5, 2021- As part of the Sea Cows Bay Enhanced Vulnerability and Capacity

Assessment (EVCA) process, the BVI Red Cross teamed up with Green VI and the Department of Waste Management for a community cleanup on December 20. BVI Red Cross' Disaster Management Officer Ms. Kristi Creque said, "At the core of this

EVCA process and disaster management is understanding the needs of the community. This awareness involves both current and historic knowledge." The cleanup is one mitigation action outlined in the EVCA. The EVCA involves risk analysis in a particular community and the identification of solutions. The cleanup, which had 35 participants, started at the well at the Ebenezer Thomas Primary School, and ended at the De La Santa Bakery.

The Sea Cows Bay EVCA was officially handed over last January. The next phase of the assessment is the micro-mitigation action plan where a team is identified to coordinate and execute the same.

To that end, Ms. Creque said, "Part of the EVCA process involves creating

a team of first responders in each community assessed. We are hoping to soon engage persons from the Sea Cows Bay community to take a first aid course." Ms. Creque said any first aid training offered as part of the EVCA is free. She encourages interested persons in Sea Cows Bay to contact the BVI Red Cross at 494-6349 or email info@redcross.vg to arrange training. The next EVCA will be done in Purcell Estate later this year.

The Enhanced Vulnerability Capacity Assessment Report is part of the BVI Red Cross Disaster Management Resilience Programme, and is being conducted in a total of six (6) communities in the Virgin Islands.

COVID-19 Vaccine To Be Made Available To BVI Residents

The Government of the Virgin Islands will be collaborating with several agencies in supporting a national programme to make the AstraZeneca vaccine available to residents on a voluntary basis.

In a statement in the House of Assembly during the Fifth Sitting of the Third Session of the Fourth House of Assembly on December 31, Minister for Health and Social Development, Honourable Carvin Malone said his ministry will work closely with Public Health England, the Caribbean Public Health

Agency, CARPHA, the Pan American Health Organisation (PAHO), and the World Health Organization (WHO) on a national programme to make the vaccine available to residents on a purely voluntary basis.

Honourable Malone said, "Published safety data indicates that this vaccine is well tolerated and has no serious safety events confirmed related to the vaccine. Safety data will continue to be collected and monitored as the vaccine is rolled out world-wide including in the BVI. Work

on a national programme to make the vaccine available to residents on a purely voluntary basis will start early in the new year in preparation for when the vaccine is delivered in the Territory."

The national programme will be led by the Ministry of Health and involve collaboration and communication with a wide cross-section of stakeholders across government, private, and non-government sectors.

The vaccine is expected to be available in the Virgin Islands in February 2021

as the United Kingdom Government plans for deployment of the vaccine throughout the Overseas Territories.

Honourable Malone explained that effective communication and innovative strategies are crucial to addressing the public's concerns regarding the vaccine. He said that the Ministry of Health's objective is to reach out to the community with information and offer vaccine to all targeted populations.

The Minister for Health said, "Vaccination of

the world's population is an important strategy to end the continued menace of COVID-19 to the world. The Territory must not only do its part in this effort, but also for our own sakes to reduce the impact of this pandemic on the Territory, its inhabitants, and our economy."

UPDATE ON THE HOUSING RECOVERY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME

*STATEMENT BY HONOURABLE CARVIN MALONE MINISTER FOR HEALTH AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT
DURING THE FIFTH SITTING OF THE THIRD SESSION OF THE FOURTH HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY OF THE VIRGIN ISLANDS
ON THURSDAY 31ST DECEMBER, 2020*

Mister Speaker, it has been some time since my last update on the Housing Recovery Assistance Programme. As we come to this -- the last day of 2020, I am pleased to present an update on the support being provided to vulnerable households by the Government of the Virgin Islands to repair and rebuild hurricane-damaged homes.

A total of six hundred and thirty-two (632) applications were received under the Housing Recovery Programme since its inception in 2018. Until such time as additional funding is provided, the programme has stopped accepting applications as of November 30, 2020 for housing assistance.

Mister Speaker, since taking office in February of 2019, this Government made several adjustments to the Housing Recovery Programme so as to ensure that a greater number of persons benefited

from the limited resources made available. Through these adjustments, assistance had been made available to vulnerable households under the following categories:

Housing Recovery General Grant (for home repairs) – up to \$100,000.00 can be allotted; Housing Recovery Social Grant (for the construction of Social homes): based on accepted evaluated tender price;

Low-Interest loan – up to \$100,000.00;

Re-Build Grant – up to \$150,000.00;

Material Grant - up to \$9,500.00;

Hurricane Shutters Grant – up to \$10,000.00;

Appliance Grant - up to \$1,500.00; and

Partial Reimbursement – up to \$15,000.00.

Mister Speaker, to date, two hundred and sixty-five (265)

beneficiaries have been approved to receive housing assistance in the forms of grants such as social grants, general grants, rebuild grants and low-interest loans from funding provided by the Government.

A total of two hundred and one (201) beneficiaries have been approved for a general grant. Of the two hundred and one (201) beneficiaries, one hundred and four (104) persons have benefited under the initial grant instituted in 2018; whereas a total of ninety-four (94) persons benefited from the new existing grant in which homes are made watertight through the installation of roofs, windows and exterior doors, together with essential electrical and plumbing works.

Under the existing grant a total of twenty-seven (27) home repair projects have been completed, thirty-two (32) home repair projects are ongoing, thirty-three (33) home repair projects are currently undergoing the contractor selection process and two (2) home repairs became ineligible during the process of award. **ALL EFFORTS ARE BEING MADE TO HAVE A GREATER NUMBER OF CONTRACTORS INVOLVED IN THE PROCESS OF REPAIRS AND RECONSTRUCTION. CONTRACTORS ARE INVITED TO REGISTER, REGISTER AND REGISTER THEIR COMPANIES FOR POSSIBLE SELECTION.**

Mister Speaker, it is important to note that under the programme, the Ministry of Health and Social Development has directly contracted thirty-six (36) local contractors and would continue to engage contractors for the repairs and rebuild of the hurricane-damaged homes.

Mister Speaker, forty (40) beneficiaries would benefit from a social grant to rebuild

their primary residence. To date, of the forty (40) social homes to be built, eleven (11) homes have been completed; Two (2) homes are still undergoing construction; Seven (7) homes are currently being tendered through the Government's public tendering process; and the remaining Twenty (20) homes are in the process to be completed in 2021. Eighteen (18) homes are currently in the design phase, two (2) homes are being considered for approval by the relevant Authorities.

Mister Speaker, twenty (20) beneficiaries would benefit from a rebuild grant to reconstruct their primary residence. To date, one (1) beneficiary has received their mobilisation to commence works on their home reconstruction. The remaining nineteen (19) beneficiaries are in the process of providing the relevant documentation to be issued their mobilization to commence reconstruction of their homes.

Mister Speaker, the low-interest loan component of the programme has had its challenges such as beneficiaries recommended for loans refused to accept the loans or fail to complete the process for the loans to be issued. Of the six (6) persons recommended for low-interest loans administered by the National Bank of the Virgin Islands only four (4) persons may complete the process. To date, two (2) loans have been processed and two (2) remains pending. The others were unable to complete the process to acquire the low-interest loans. More so, applicants are not interested in the low-interest loans. Mister Speaker, a balance of two hundred and ten thousand dollars (\$210,000) has been committed to date and only \$80,000 issued.

Mister Speaker, the Material

Grant was introduced in November 2019, in an effort to assist homeowners who are able to meet their own labour costs, but require some assistance in purchasing much needed building supplies. Since the inception in November 2019, two hundred and sixty one (261) persons benefited from the material grant programme. A total of One Million, Four Hundred Twenty-Three Thousand, Two Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars and Sixty Cents (\$1,423,277.60) have been spent for the programme. Mister Speaker, the material grant component provided an immediate relief to affected households to purchase small quantities of building materials from local suppliers.

Mister Speaker, the Ministry of Health and Social Development have evaluated and has approved twenty-eight (28) grants for the purchase of Hurricane Shutters and another forty (40) grants for the purchase of appliances destroyed during the storms of 2020. The funds are scheduled for distribution in the New Year 2021.

Mister Speaker our Partial Reimbursement grant would also be considered in the New Year 2021 and three (3) applications have been received for consideration and approval as funding in this regard has been rather limited.

In closing, I commend the diligent efforts of the team of Public Officers across several Ministries and Departments, contractors, and other partners in the implementation of the Housing Recovery Assistance Programme. As we enter into the New Year, the Ministry of Health and Social Development will continue to press forward to address those persons who are still in need of housing recovery assistance. *Thank you Mister Speaker.*

GLOBAL NEWS BRIEF

STORIES SELECTED BY GIORGIO MIGLIAVACCA

USA - WASHINGTON — As the U.S. COVID-19 death toll surpassed 350,000 Sunday, President Trump claimed the country's fatality count toll was "far exaggerated," an assertion that was quickly refuted by the nation's top infectious-diseases expert.

"The deaths are real deaths," Dr. Anthony Fauci said in an ABC interview. "That's not fake."

Trump also suggested Sunday on Twitter that states, not the federal government, bore responsibility for a vaccine rollout lagging expectations. Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti countered Trump's assertion, saying states and municipalities had been denied crucial resources to move ahead more expeditiously.

"We have not been delivered what was promised at the national level," Garcetti said on CBS' "Face the Nation." The federal government, he added, "can't tell the local governments and state governments to do something and not give us aid." (Los Angeles Times)

IRELAND - The Irish author of a new book about refugees and asylum seekers says that desperate migrants will continue to die in the Channel until the government show more compassion.

Declan Henry, author of *Young Refugees and Asylum Seekers: The Truth about Britain*, told The

Irish World: "That will continue until somebody really sits down, this if the Home Office and the Government, with aid agencies and looks at resettlement programmes and really allows people in legally. Until then people are always going to find a way in, especially people in desperate situations.

"Britain is the 6th richest country in the world and I think it's well within its means to take in more refugees. We have only taken in a small amount in comparison to other European countries."

Almost 300 migrants including 36 children have died trying to cross the Channel by small boat, ferry and the Channel Tunnel since 1999.

Just last month a whole Kurdish-Iranian family, which included two small children, drowned while in August British authorities were blamed by the French for the death of 16-year-old Sudanese boy.

"You see the spontaneous arrivals that arrive daily on boats to Dover and the likes so many do lost their lives at sea. It's very dangerous." [Irish World]

SANTO DOMINGO - The Ministry of Tourism reports that 24 beaches in the Dominican Republic have been certified as Blue Flag beaches for 2020-2021. The Environmental Law Institute of the Dominican Republic (IDARD) is responsible for issuing the certificates.

The Blue Flag program (Bandera Azul) is an international ecolabel that promotes high quality and sustainability standards in beaches operation. To receive the certificate, the properties must comply with water quality, environmental management, safety, accessibility criteria set by the international program. [DR1]

BERMUDA - The health minister tonight condemned "disturbing" breaches of coronavirus rules as another 18 cases of the virus were reported.

A total of seven came in from overseas and seven were the result of on-island transmissions with a known contact.

The sources of the other four cases is under investigation.

Kim Wilson, the Minister of Health, said: "We have been made aware of some disturbing social activities over the New Year's holiday that saw a significant number of individuals at a location who were not engaging in safe practices.

"Reckless behaviour such as this is unfortunate, and we understand that the Bermuda Police Service is investigating the incident.

"I cannot emphasise enough the importance of making sensible and responsible decisions."

The fresh cases were among 1,925 test results that came back to health officials since Thursday.

The overseas cases include three residents who flew to Bermuda from London on the December 23 British Airways flight and tested positive on their Day 8 test. [Royal Gazette]

TURKS & CAICOS - The Government of the Turks and Caicos Islands Government (TCIG) has negotiated an \$80million Revolving Credit Facility (RCF) with Republic Bank as sole lender. A government press release said that following a competitive procurement process, Republic Bank was selected as the bank with the lowest 'all-in' cost (i.e. including both interest and fees) having received a number of very competitive proposals.

The 12-month loan carries a fixed rate of interest of 2.9% and can be extended by a further 12 months at the government's option, and/or increased to \$100m with the agreement of the bank.

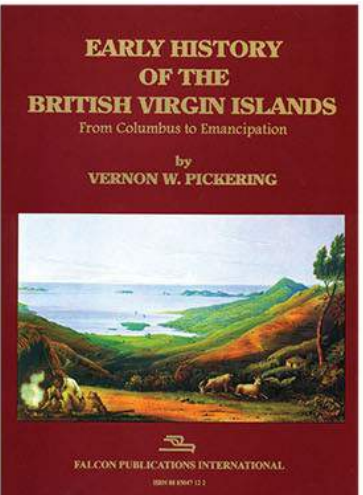
Following the announcement on 27 October the government launched a competitive procurement process with a Request for Proposals (RFP) in respect of this first stage of a debt strategy to manage the impact of the pandemic, and this loan has been secured just 7 weeks later. The second stage of the strategy will be developed in 2021 as the post Covid-19 outlook becomes clearer and then executed after the election.

Premier and Minister of Finance Sharlene Cartwright-Robinson said: "I am pleased to see that, despite the extraordinary challenges caused by the pandemic, we have been able to attract significant competitive interest from a number of banks to fund the full \$80m requested. This is in large part thanks to years of responsible fiscal management, successive surpluses, long term debt reduction and transparent communication. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Governor and the FCO Officials for their critical support to the process, Team Finance, the AG's Chambers, and my Cabinet colleagues for their respective contributions to this important financing. I am also excited to welcome Republic Bank to the Turks and Caicos Islands and am optimistic that the Bank will become an important source of funding in the wider economy here." [The T. & C. Sun]

MOSCOW - President Vladimir Putin has exhausted his political agenda. Even his recent referendum to "reset" the political clock hasn't helped. Putin might physically remain in power for some time, but he has already become a "lame duck" president in the eyes of many people, a leader on his way out the door. Nobody — not even loyalists — has any hope that the country will improve while Putin remains in office.

The only real questions now are, When will all of this end? and Who

will be the next president? In Russia, the prime minister is traditionally the first in line as successor, which is why the appointment of Mikhail Mishustin to that post was one of the most important political events of the year.

Although Putin can now legally run for re-election in 2024, he might opt to step down and name a successor instead. After witnessing how Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko's attempt to remain in sparked widespread unrest this year, Putin knows the same thing might happen here. The Russian people are getting tired of him.

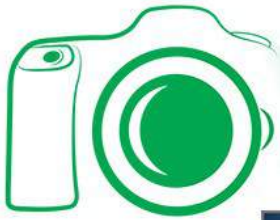
His trust rating has dipped below 50%, meaning that more than one-half of the population does not want to vote for him. Although short-term bursts of popularity are theoretically possible still, long-term growth is unlikely. The president's electoral base will continue to dwindle. As someone averse to risk, Putin might prefer to cede some of his power to a successor rather than risk everything as Lukashenko did. [Moscow Times]

DEPUTY COMMISSIONER OF POLICE AWARDED QUEEN'S TOP MEDAL

Thursday, December 31 – The Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Alwin James has been awarded the Queen's Police Medal in Her Majesty the Queen's 2021 New Year Honours. DCP James received this Medal in recognition of his significant contributions to the Royal Virgin Islands Police Force, where he has served for 35 years at both operational and strategic levels.

Acting Governor Mr. David D. Archer shared warm wishes to DCP James, saying, "I am thrilled to see the Deputy Commissioner receive this recognition from her Majesty the Queen. I have seen first-hand his commitment to serving this Territory and his incredible bravery and self-sacrifice in the line of duty. He is an exceptional leader and an asset to the Royal Virgin Islands Police Force and the Territory. I wish him my warmest congratulations on this distinguished Honour."

DCP James was appointed Acting Deputy Commissioner of Police in 2012 and was promoted to the rank substantively in late 2013. He served as Acting Commissioner for an extended period in 2015, and played a critical part in the response to the catastrophic hurricanes in 2017. In the aftermath of the hurricanes and despite the lack of police

resources and infrastructure, he worked to re-establish the Territory's security.

More recently, DCP James has been instrumental to the Royal Virgin Islands Police Force's response to COVID-19, including efforts to secure the Territory's borders.

Commissioner of Police Mr. Michael Matthews said, "This is a richly deserved recognition for our Deputy Commissioner of Police, and it not only highlights his excellent services to policing, but also is a testimony to the dedication he has given to the communities of the British Virgin Islands. I have enjoyed the privilege of working hand in glove with Alwin James for the past five years, and he is without doubt one of the finest police officers and deputies I have ever worked with. This award speaks volumes for his commitment and professionalism, and not only reflects highly upon him as an individual officer, but upon all of those who have supported him within the Royal Virgin Islands Police Force."

Upon receiving the Honour, DCP James said, "I am both honored and humbled to be nominated and awarded the Queen's Police Medal. It has caught me by surprise - it is not one I anticipated. I took an oath to serve the communities of

this Territory 35-plus years ago, and this is a proud moment for the RVIPF and its members that contribute daily to assist me in delivering to the Territory despite the challenges."

The Queen's Police Medal was established in 1909 and has become one of the most prestigious honours given to law enforcement officers. Each year, it is awarded to a small number of individuals who have shown gallantry and distinguished service.

SCOOTER/CYCLES COLLISIONS LEAD IN ACCIDENTS WITH INJURIES

Thursday, December 31 – Ten of the 15 accidents with injuries reported in during the month of December alone involved scooters or motorcycles, with eight of the ten riders requiring hospitalisation.

Chief Inspector Dariel Robinson noted that December stats alone indicate that collisions involving these

two-wheel vehicles are extraordinarily high. Half of these vehicles were removed from the scene before Police arrived likely to prevent confiscation. These actions suggest that the vehicles were likely neither licenced nor insured.

"Large numbers of scooters and cycles are confiscated by

the RVIPF monthly when used illegally on the roadways, yet the numbers on the road are steadily increasing. Limits and conditions must be set by other sectors of the community, both public and private, to regulate purchases and insured lawful requirements are fulfilled prior to procurement of these vehicles. For the year 2021, management policies will be necessary at all levels for there to be safety on the roads and to reduce the danger of riders," the Chief Inspector said.

In 2020, there were five road fatalities. Of the five, three were as a result of scooter collisions.

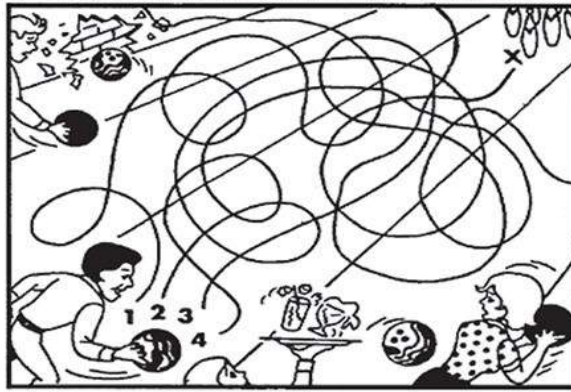

EASY SUPPER SHAKSHUKA

- 2 tablespoons olive oil • 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 teaspoon red chile flakes or 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper or 1/4 teaspoon hot sauce
- 1 teaspoon salt • 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon paprika • 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/8 teaspoon ground cloves or cinnamon
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 cups prepared marinara sauce
- 2 cups fresh baby spinach • 4 eggs
- 1 1/2 cup feta cheese
- Cilantro, basil or parsley leaves, chopped (optional)

1. In a large skillet over medium heat, add the olive oil, then add the chopped onion, the chile flakes or cayenne pepper or hot sauce, salt, pepper, paprika, cumin and cloves or cinnamon, and cook for 5 minutes, or until the onion becomes soft and translucent. Add the garlic and cook for another 1-2 minutes.
2. Stir in the marinara sauce and turn the heat to high to bring the sauce to a boil. Add the spinach, one handful at a time, and stir it in to wilt it.
3. Turn the heat to low. Using the back of a large spoon, make 4 indentions (wells) in the sauce to place the eggs. Gently crack the eggs in the skillet into the indentions in the tomato sauce and cover the skillet with a lid for 3 to 5 minutes, or until the whites of the eggs are cooked and set.
4. Sprinkle the feta cheese around the eggs and on top of the sauce. Garnish with the cilantro, basil or parsley, if desired, and serve warm with crusty bread or rolls to mop up the sauce. Serves 4.

'Butch' Stewart passes 'There will never be another quite like him'

Founder and chairman of the ATL Group of Companies, Gordon "Butch" Stewart passed away last night. He was 79.

Stewart, who is also chairman of the Jamaica Observer, will be most remembered for his multiple award-winning Sandals and Beaches Resorts, which helped to establish the Caribbean, especially Jamaica, as a world-class tourist destination.

Last night, his son Adam, who is deputy chairman of the ATL Group, said his father's passing was "almost unbelievable", since he was as involved and forward-thinking as ever.

"He chose to keep a very recent health diagnosis private and we respected that wish," the younger Stewart said.

"He was a marketing genius and talented showman, but those who knew him best recognised that he was a dreamer who could dream bigger and better than anyone. It was often said, 'The best thing for people around him to do is be dream catchers.' That's why he always credited his success to the incredible team around him, why he listened intently when it came to creating innovative things that would excite and delight our guests, and why it is so important that I remind you today, of all days, that we will all continue to be his dream catchers."

"Together, we have all been part of something

bigger than ourselves, led by a man who believed in us and who gave us opportunities to learn, grow, and the tools to make dreams real. For him, and because of him, we will continue to dream big and deliver on his certainty that true luxury is always best enjoyed by the sea.

"My Dad lived a big life – husband, father, grandfather, great grandfather, entrepreneur, statesman, dreamer. A singular personality and an unstoppable force who revelled in defying the odds, exceeding expectations, and whose passion for his family was matched only by the people and possibility of the Caribbean, for whom he was a fierce champion.

"There will never be another quite like him and we will miss him forever."

Stewart's accomplishments in tourism and business in general won him many awards and honours, most notably the Order of Jamaica. He was also invested as Commander of the Order of Distinction.

In 2001 he received the honorary Doctor of Laws degree from The University of the West Indies and then from the University of Technology, Jamaica in 2009.

In 1992, Stewart was presented with the Dr Martin Luther King Jr Humanitarian Award from the Jamaica/America Society, and Ernst & Young saw it fit to name him

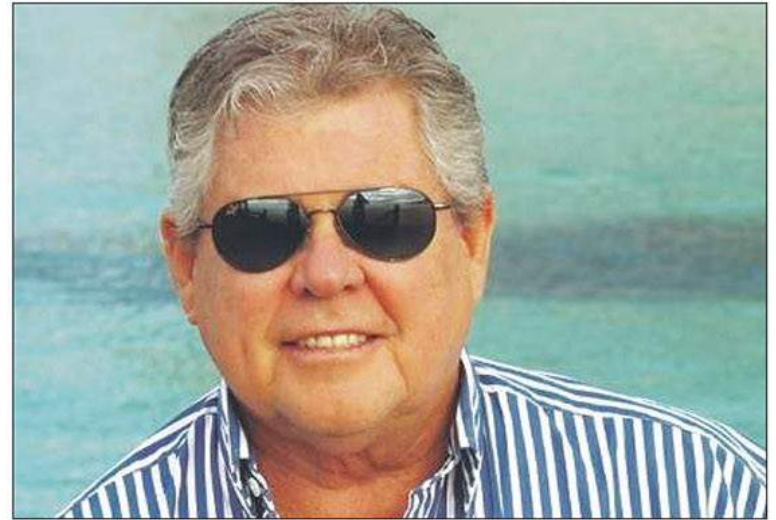
Master Entrepreneur of the decade of the 90s.

Born on July 6, 1941, the first child of Jean Patricia nee Rerrie and Gordon Leslie Stewart, at Nuttall Memorial Hospital near Cross Roads in Kingston, Gordon Arthur Cyril Stewart, simply "Butch" to his legion of admirers, was truly Jamaica's first international superstar of business.

The virtual hero-worship which surrounded him was firmly anchored in genuine admiration for his enormous skill as a marketer and entrepreneur extraordinaire, his depth of generosity bequeathed to him by his father, his own sense of honour, and, importantly, his infectious joie de vivre.

The "Butch" Stewart story began, not in the glitter and glamour of latter days, but in relative modesty in a time when his parents had to fend for themselves. He was a man of the people; eloquent in the vernacular, not averse to dropping or taking a six-love in dominoes, the people's game; and men will remember and celebrate him as a local boy who made good.

For sure, his distant ancestry stretches back to colonial England, but he knew what it was to be taken out of boarding school in Kingston because his parents could no longer afford the fees and to be sent to the rough and tumble of a school where dropouts ruled tough.

His father, Gordon Leslie Cox came to Jamaica as a baby of six months, and when the marriage of his parents went on the rocks, was adopted by a wealthy St Ann couple, Ethel and Cyril Stewart, distant relatives who changed his name to Gordon Leslie Stewart — later to be the legendary chief engineer at the then Jamaica Broadcasting Corporation (JBC), the State-owned radio and television complex. Intriguingly, Ethel Stewart who doted on the infant Butch, died, leaving her £1,000,000 fortune to charity. Butch's dad therefore had to fend for himself, trying his hand unsuccessfully at business before finally taking a job to feed his family.

Well before he was 10 years old, Butch learnt how to do what Jamaicans like to refer to as 'hustle', using creative ways to make money. He had an early obsession with the sea and buying a boat, caught fish to sell to hotels and

transported celebrities, including the actress Joan Collins. He saved like mad to buy his boat. Later he bought old cars, fixed them, and sold them at a profit. But it would be years hence that people would come to realise that all that was mere practice for the empire on the horizon.

As a salesman with an irresistible pitch, he built Appliance Traders Limited on some of the top brand names in the world; dreamed that he could conquer the world of tourism, and built Sandals that today rates among the most luxurious hotel chains in the world; launched a newspaper that changed Jamaican journalism; and bought an airline that carried the hope and pride of a nation – the little piece of Jamaica that flies – but which defied his considerable genius in the face of political shenanigans.

Democrats Win Key US Senate Runoff with second Georgia Race too close to Call

Control of the U.S. Senate hung in the balance Wednesday with the result of one of two runoff elections in the southern state of Georgia still too close to call.

Democrats moved closer to regaining control of the chamber with the Rev. Raphael Warnock's projected defeat of Sen. Kelly Loeffler in one of Tuesday's elections.

U.S. media organizations called the race with Warnock leading Loeffler by more than 40,000 votes and nearly all ballots counted.

"We were told that we couldn't win this election, but tonight we proved that with hope, hard work and the people by our side, anything is possible," Warnock said in a message to his supporters late Tuesday.

In the second election, Democrat Jon Ossoff, a television documentary producer, led by more than 12,000 votes over Republican David Perdue, who was seeking a second six-year term in office.

Going into Tuesday's voting, Republicans controlled the 100-seat Senate with a 50-48 advantage, needing to win one of the Georgia contests to keep their majority and act as a bulwark against Democratic President-elect Joe Biden's legislative proposals after he is inaugurated January 20.

With Warnock's victory, an Ossoff win would give Democrats a 50-50 split with Republicans and a chance for Vice President-elect Kamala Harris, who will be able to preside over Senate

proceedings when she chooses, to cast tie-breaking votes in the Democrats' favor.

Democrats already narrowly control the House of Representatives. With Democratic control of both houses of Congress, Biden would likely offer more sweeping proposals to bolster health care in the United States, tighten environmental controls that were eased during the four-year tenure of President Donald Trump and try to make it easier for immigrants to gain U.S. citizenship.

Conversely, Republican control of the Senate would make Biden's political life more difficult and likely force protracted negotiations between his administration and Republican lawmakers on contentious issues.

The controlling party in the chamber also sets the legislative calendar, determining which issues are voted on while also holding a majority on each of the Senate's issue-specific committees where potential laws are first considered.

The Perdue-Ossoff and Loeffler-Warnock contests were made necessary because none of the four candidates won a majority in the first round of voting in November.

Voter turnout was robust on Tuesday, with long lines of voters snaking into polling places, and came after nearly 3.1 million people cast ballots before the official Election Day. Five million votes were cast in Georgia in the November

balloting that included Biden's race against Trump.

The overall vote count in U.S. runoff elections usually lags general elections, but about 100,000 people who did not vote in November in Georgia cast ballots in the Senate runoffs even before the official Election Day.

In the November vote, Biden became the first Democratic presidential candidate to win in Georgia since 1992.

Trump has repeatedly claimed without evidence that he was defrauded out of winning the state, pleading in an extraordinary phone call last weekend with Georgia Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger to find him 11,780 more votes – enough to upend the Biden win by a single vote. But Raffensperger, a Republican, rebuffed Trump, saying he was "just plain

wrong" in contending he was cheated out of a victory in the state.

Loeffler said she would support Trump's challenge to Biden's victory in Georgia when a joint session of Congress meets Wednesday to certify Biden's 306-232 victory in the Electoral College, which determines the outcome of U.S. presidential elections rather than the national popular vote.

Election Day exit polls conducted by Edison Research indicated about seven in 10 Georgia voters were confident that the votes in Tuesday's runoff elections would be counted accurately. Democrats were far more confident than Republicans.

Both Biden and Trump held rallies Monday in Georgia in a final attempt to persuade voters.

"The power is literally in your hands," Biden said. "Unlike any time in my career, one state, one state, can chart the course, not just for the next four years, but for the next generation."

He said Georgians had voted in record numbers in the presidential election in November. "Now, we need you to vote again in record numbers," he said.

Trump campaigned Monday in a heavily Republican enclave in Dalton in the northern part of the state, telling supporters the election could be their "last chance to save the America that we love."

"The far left wants to destroy our country, demolish our history and erase everything that we hold dear," Trump said. "This could be the most important vote you will ever cast for the rest of your life."

McMaster, Malone head BVI Top 30 Athletes in last 50 years

400m Hurdler Kyron McMaster and Long Jumper Chantel Malone, have been named as the athletes heading the Top 30 Men's and Women's list over the last 50 years, following a six part Dec 26-31, BVI Athletics Association 50th Anniversary reflection series on VISports and Culture Facebook page, presented by JOMA Properties, by founding member and longest serving President, Rey O'Neal.

During the series, O'Neal, who at 21, became the BVIAA's 2nd President behind Hubert Payne in November 1970 after the association was formed on September 19, 1970, recalled the development of the body he governed 1970-73 and for a second stint—1978-2003. He's a member of the Association of Track and Field Statisticians, and an international correspondent for Track & Field News among other publications.

In coming up with the Top 30 athletes between 1970-2020, O'Neal said he put together a list of some of the athletes who he though distinguished themselves most in the last 50 years of the BVIAA. He said that he went with athletes who in one respect or another had created an impact either locally, regionally/international or at collegiate levels.

"The mistake that people would tend to make, would be how do you have Dale Abrahamson or Rose Phillips (from the 70s)..... they were the best of their generation and not only the best at that time in the British Virgin Islands," O'Neal explained. "Rose was in all likelihood the best sprinter in the small islands of the Eastern Caribbean, taking away Barbados."

Abrahamson won an 800m bronze medal in the Southern Games in Trinidad in 1971—the biggest invitational meet in the Caribbean—after recording a time of 1 minute 54.8 seconds in the first external competition for BVI athletes in St. Croix on November 22, 1970, a mark that 50 years later, stands as No 4 on the BVI All Time List. O'Neal noted that there were not many championships meets either at the time and the BVI could not participate in the CAC Games, Commonwealth Games, Pan Am Games or Olympic Games because the territory didn't have an Olympic Committee until 1980. At 16, Phillips became the first BVI CAC Championships finalist, placing seventh in the Long Jump in 1975, in Ponce, Puerto Rico.

Other athletes such as Cecil Dawson an argument can be made for, O'Neal said as he was perhaps the best all round athlete the territory has produced. Gene Hodge won a Discus Throw medal in Barbados in 1971 and O'Neal said 10 years ago, he could not have imagined a BVI athlete throwing the shot put over 71 feet, which Eldred Henry has done and is No 2 in CAC competition and No 7 furthest among black throwers. Kyron McMaster has been world ranked 2nd, 3rd and 4th in 2017, 2018 and 2019 and is among the Top 20 All 400m Hurdlers. Chantel Malone became the first Sr. World Championships finalist in 2017 and was 7th in 2017. Tahesia Harrigan was ranked No 10 in the world in 2010 in the 100m. From the early days to present, the list he notes has quality on it.

"I think it's a pretty comprehensive list and I tried to touch all the bases so to speak," said O'Neal who was head of the association of 28 of its 50 years. "Some of the names go back quite a way and the generation of 2020 might not have the slightest idea who they were because they could be competing against their grandchildren."

In his reflection, the veteran administrator who is also a former BVI Olympic Committee President and founding member, said there aren't that many short sprinters—100/200m runners as one might think on the list. He noted that until Rikkoi Brathwaite won a Carifta Games U20 Boys 100m bronze medal in the Bahamas in 2018, there were no male medalists in the competition before him, although there had been many participants.

"In fact, only one prior to Rikkoi—that would be Derwin Scatliffe (U17 Boys) way back in 1987—he was the only other 100m finalist among the boys," O'Neal pointed out. "We have a few 400m runners, not that many in the middle distances. It started off with Dale Abrahamson, then we got to Jerry Molyneaux and then Greg Rhymer. There are other athletes on the list who could have been pretty good 800m runners—Steve Augustine, Mario Todman and others—but they concentrated their efforts elsewhere. Among the throwers, we have Eldred Henry. Before him Eric Matthias was one of the better Discus Throwers at the Jr. level and he had a decent collegiate career as well."

O'Neal noted that Omar Jones was a Jr. College Javelin Throw champion. Regarding

multi events, Paul Hewlette still has the Decathlon national record dating back to 1987. "One who could have been and perhaps should have been but in the only actual Decathlon that he tried, he got injured, that was Rupert Solomon. We have not done very well in developing distance runners. Anderson Legair was the best that we had, the was the OECS 3000m Steeplechase record holder for a while. He's one of the two athletes on the list from Virgin Gorda, which is not to say Virgin Gorda didn't have good athletes, but they just never stuck with it very long. So, we've kept going and hopefully, when the 60th year comes around, we'll have 60 athletes—although we have 60 athletes—30 men and 30 women—but we hope progress continues."

Women:

Men carried the association between 1970-2004 before making a recent resurgence while women came to the fore in 2005, with Tahesia Harrigan-Scott leading the charge.

"There has been a big step up since the early days," O'Neal noted. "If you look at the list, of those in the generation before 1980, there was Rose Phillips and not much else."

O'Neal said there are a number of throwers—more so in the boys than the girls—but there are some good girls. Tynelle and Trevia Gumbs and in more recent times, there have been a few Javelin Throwers—Akira Phillip, Britney Peters and Heptathlete Arianna Hayde. In the Long and Triple Jumps, he said there hasn't been that many as the better jumpers have been primarily something else. Rose Phillips had the Long Jump record for a number of years and there were others who dabbled in the Long Jump and perhaps more so in the Triple Jump.

"For instance, I think Chantel Scatliffe could have been a pretty good Triple Jumper, but she was mainly a 400, 800/1500m runner," he said. "High Jump, not that many. There were several who showed promise but, I can't recall many except Chantel Malone who participated in the High Jump, outside of their junior career. In fact, Chantel did not do that either, because when she equaled the national record, it was in a local meet when she came home from the University of Texas—still a Jr. athlete."

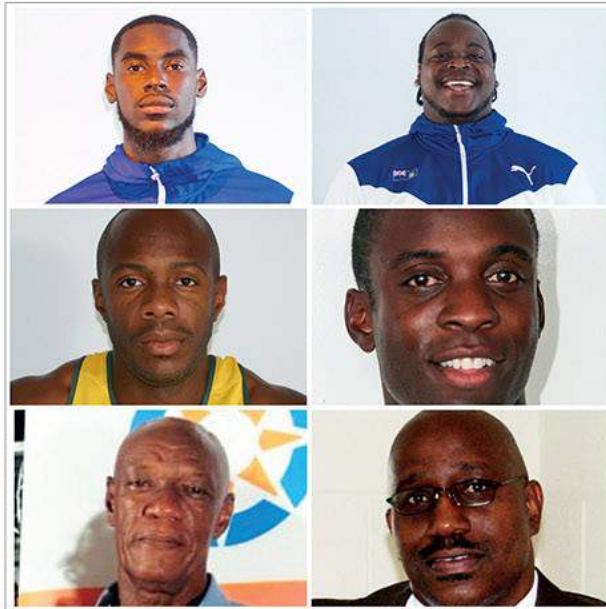

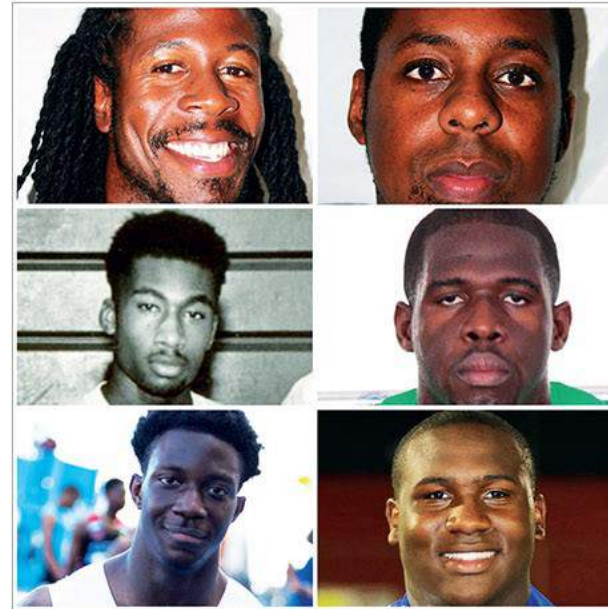

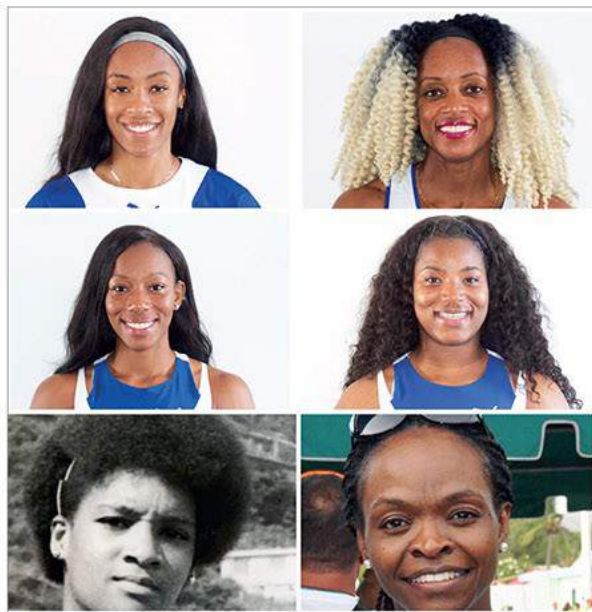
BVI Athletics Association's top athletes over the last 50 years



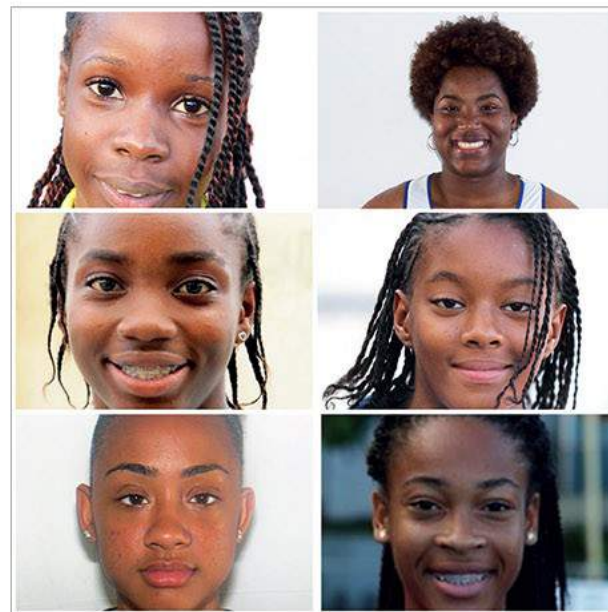

British Firms Mull Relocating To 'Other Side of Brexit Curtain'

VOA - Despite Britain sealing a post-Brexit deal with the European Union, one that will allow for tariff-free trade in goods, some British firms are considering fully or partially relocating their businesses to mainland Europe, saying they fear for their prospects if they don't. How many is unclear — no one is yet keeping tally.

A year ago, a British business lobby group, the Institute of Directors, found in a survey that a third of small-to-mid-size enterprises [SMEs] were planning or considering relocating or setting up additional facilities on the other side of the Brexit curtain.

Dutch investment authorities say they have lured 140 Brexit-wary companies since Britain's 2016 referendum to quit the EU, and more than another 100 are exploring moves. Other EU countries also are reporting record numbers of British firms moving or considering full or partial relocations. Slovakia, within a year of the 2016 Brexit referendum, saw 400 British firms register new businesses in the country, including Jaguar Land Rover, which currently is building a new plant near Nitra in western Slovakia.

Among Slovak-bound British businesses is the Goodfish Group, a company based in the English Midlands, and which, until the Brexit referendum, largely made plastic injection moldings for British-based auto-manufacturers. It must diversify, mainly through acquisitions, thanks to a serious fall-off in orders since the referendum, and to turn its focus to supplying moldings for other sectors, including retail. The company exports a third of its products to EU countries and since the referendum, needs to close one of four factories.

Greg McDonald, who founded Goodfish Group in 2010 after a 25-year career in investment management and corporate development, is rueful about Brexit and disparaging about Britain's politicians, who he says just don't understand the complexity and importance of supply chains and the nitty gritty of everyday business outside banking or PR. "They have not got a clue — they are so far removed," he says.

McDonald initially registered a company in Slovakia to be ready to transfer some production there in the event of Britain failing to conclude a tariff-free trade deal with the EU. The agreement, struck Christmas Eve and which was approved midweek by the House of Commons, doesn't satisfy him, and he's completed the legal requirements to start trading in Slovakia. He now must sign a lease on a factory, which will complement the three plants he currently runs in Britain.

Speaking Wednesday in the Commons, British Prime Minister Boris Johnson lauded the deal, which gives tariff and quota-free access to Europe's Single Market when it comes to goods and parts, saying it will mark the start of "what will be a wonderful relationship between Britain and our friends and partners in the EU." He added: "We were told we could not have our cake and eat it." Johnson Thursday described the new year's severing of ties with the EU as "an amazing moment" for Britain, saying Brexit had put "freedom in our hands" and that the British would be able to do things "differently and better" outside the EU.

Hours after speaking, Johnson's father Stanley, a former European Parliament lawmaker, revealed he

is applying for French citizenship. Stanley Johnson's mother was born in France.

McDonald fears that's not the way it will turn out. "We are going to have tariff-free access but there are all sorts of other ways business will be stifled," he says. He cites the burden of additional customs paperwork and inspections and likely slower transfers at ports that will add to costs and reduce price competitiveness.

Because of this, foreign-based auto-manufacturers will reduce their production in Britain, he forecasts. "Honda, Toyota, BMW will make in Britain what they need to satisfy the domestic UK market but not, as before, for the whole of the EU market," he adds.

Much of industry across Europe is dependent on parts moving easily, seamlessly from factory to factory, across open borders, with few delays and inspections and little paperwork, if any. That has meant firms can rely on just-in-time delivery of parts, products and goods they need. For British businesses in the automotive industry, as well as in other manufacturing sectors, trading will now be much more complicated.

McDonald hopes by starting up production also in Slovakia and "being on the right side of the Brexit curtain," as he puts it, Goodfish, which currently employs 110 full-time workers and 25 part-time or agency employees and has a turnover of \$18 million, will have a better shot at competing in a much bigger market.

Trying to navigate Brexit has been a strain for him. He apologizes for his raspy voice, explaining he's developed stress-related muscle tension dysphonia. "Surprise, surprise," he adds.

Supply chain challenges, burdensome paperwork and the impact of shipping delays, plus increased costs, is worrying small and mid-sized enterprises across Britain that trade with the EU.

"Manufacturers and farmers will face irksome checks at borders for things like customs, VAT (value added tax), safety and security, plant and animal health, and much more. Services companies will lose access to the single market unless they set up subsidiaries within it," notes Charles Grant of the Center for European Reform [CER], a London-based research organization.

In an analysis for CER this week, Grant says some British manufactures will struggle to meet the deal's requirements when it comes to the origin of components and products in their goods. A high percentage of the components used must have been made in either Britain or EU countries and nowhere else to qualify for zero EU tariffs or to avoid quotas.

"Boris Johnson's post-deal victory speech, in which he falsely declared the deal would mean 'no non-tariff barriers,' suggests a government still struggling to fully understand the consequences" of the trade deal," Grant said. When it comes to the automotive industry, there's relief a trade deal has been agreed upon, says Paul Lund of Fitch Ratings, an American credit rating agency. He describes it, though, as "one step better than the worst case."

The worry, he explains, was how "tariffs would be set on parts coming to Britain, being put in cars and then the cars being exported [to the EU] and what the ultimate rate would be on exported cars" to the EU. That threat has now disappeared.

Thousands Storm US Capitol in 'Shameful Assault on Our Democracy'

WASHINGTON - [VOA] - Thousands of flag-waving supporters of U.S. President Donald Trump swarmed over the U.S. Capitol on Wednesday, forcing lawmakers to evacuate their chambers and delaying by several hours a normally routine procedure clearing the way for Joe Biden and Kamala Harris to be sworn in as president and vice president on Jan. 20.

House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi announced after hours of chaos around the white-columned edifice that police had secured the area and legislators would reconvene to continue the work of certifying the Electoral College vote that determines the next president.

"Today, a shameful assault was made on our democracy," Pelosi said. "It was anointed at the highest level of government. It cannot, however, deter us from our responsibility to validate the election of Joe Biden," she said.

Hours earlier, U.S. television audiences were riveted by live images of closely packed rioters clambering over the exterior of the building, which includes both the House and the Senate. Hundreds more pushed past Capitol Police and poured into the building.

"Where are they?" a Trump supporter demanded as some tried to break down the doors of the House of Representatives chamber.

Rep. Scott Peters, a California Democrat, told reporters he was in the House chamber when the mob began storming it. He said security officers urged lawmakers to put on gas masks and herded them into a corner of the massive room.

News channels showed photographs of plainclothes police officers with handguns drawn, guarding House members as rioters tried to break through a door. A woman was shot in the melee and later died, a spokesperson for the D.C. Metropolitan Police Department said, adding late Wednesday that no other details were available. Once inside, one Trump supporter sat in the chair where Vice President Mike Pence had been presiding over the Electoral



College discussions before they were interrupted, apparently taking selfies with his phone.

By 5 p.m. local time, Washington Police Chief Robert Contee said the protest had been declared a riot, and at least 13 arrests had been made. Mayor Muriel Bowser imposed a 6 p.m. curfew, and the D.C. National Guard was activated.

Elsewhere, a pipe bomb was found and safely detonated outside the headquarters of the Republican National Committee and a suspicious package prompted the evacuation of the nearby Democratic National Committee, according to The New York Times. Both are within

blocks of the Capitol.

The top Democrat in the U.S. Senate called Thursday for President Donald Trump's immediate removal from office with 13 days left in his presidency after he urged a crowd of angry supporters to march on the U.S. Capitol, where they overran the building.

"What happened at the U.S. Capitol yesterday was an insurrection against the United States incited by the president. This president should not hold office one day longer," said Sen. Chuck Schumer of New York.

Schumer, set to become the Senate majority leader soon, said the "quickest and most effective way" to oust Trump from the White House would be for Vice President Mike Pence and a majority of Trump's Cabinet to invoke the 25th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution to declare that he is incapacitated and unable to continue in office.

"It can be done today," Schumer said, but "If the vice president and the Cabinet refuse to stand up, Congress should reconvene to impeach the president." A handful of other lawmakers, including House speaker Nancy Pelosi, also called for Trump's removal through use of the constitutional provision or his impeachment for a second time, even though President-elect Joe Biden is set to take office January 20.
